WELCOMING ADDRESS BY THE LORD MAYOR OF HALLE

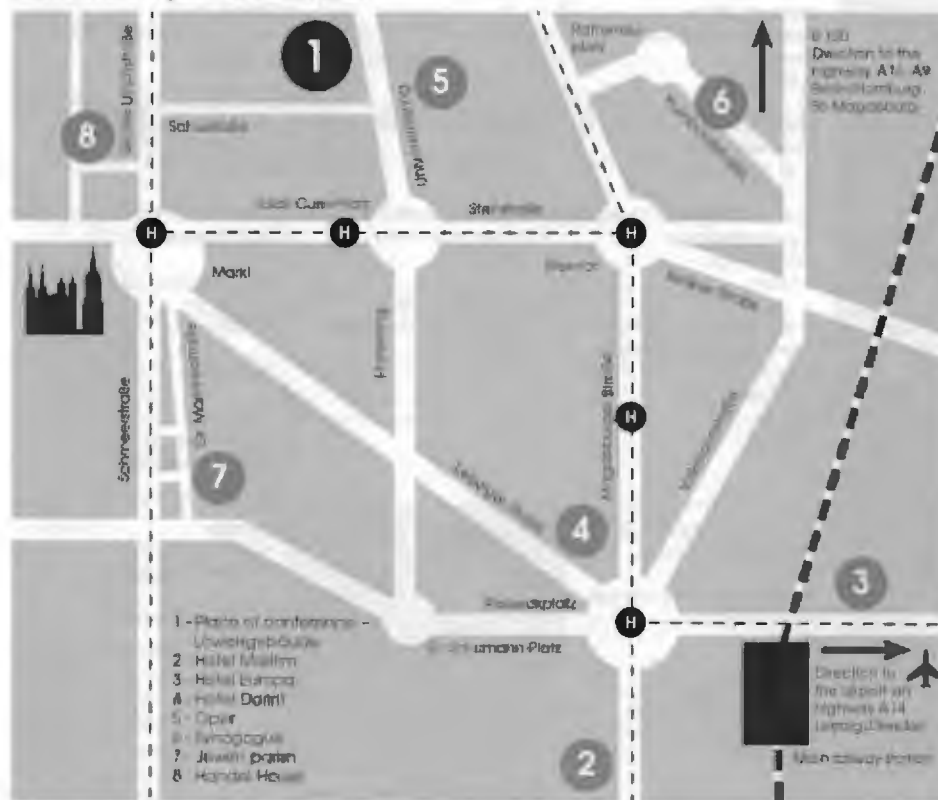
